NEW FMH EMERGING LEADERS

In early November, several members from Farmers Mutual Hail attended the CIRB Fall Fly-in event in Washington, D.C. In addition to executive committee meetings, the Fly-in event is used as an opportunity to speak with congressmen and congresswomen on Capitol Hill about supporting crop insurance. For two FMH employees, it was an exciting first-hand look at advocating in Washington, D.C. as participants in the CIRB Emerging Leaders Program (ELP).

Sheila Backer, Insurance Specialist Manager I, and Chad Groen, Regional Claims Manager, are participating in the 2017-18 class of Emerging Leaders, a program designed to help build the next generation of crop insurance leaders.

Backer and Groen, along with the five other ELP participations, kicked off the fly-in event with a class about advocating in Washington before sitting in on the CIRB executive meeting. FMH President and CEO Ron Rutledge is currently serving as CIRB Chairman and led the executive meeting. After the meeting concluded, all CIRB attendees were divided into groups for office visits on Capitol Hill.

"We had 28 people from CIRB to make 40 different appointments on the Hill," noted Groen. "We not only visited with ranking House and Senate Ag Committee members, but also with many first-term representatives that have never voted on a Farm Bill, so we really had an opportunity to educate a lot of congressmen and congresswomen about crop insurance and its importance to farmers and rural America."

The fly-in event brings together members from all across the industry to deliver a unified message to those in Washington.

"It was great to see the different AIP's come together for one common goal. Even though we may be competitors in our dayto-day jobs, we know how vital crop insurance is – not only to the American farmer, but also to urban folks who are able to eat the food they do, because of farmers," said Backer. "We can work together to make sure the message is spread to all folks in D.C. prior to a new Farm Bill in 2018." Even though they were new to the advocating in Washington, D.C., Backer and Groen were involved in many of the conversations. As participants in ELP, Groen and Backer will take their advocating skills back to their communities this winter.

"While visiting the Hill, people asked me what my views from the field were about the 2014 Farm Bill changes," said Groen. "It was really awesome that they were interested in what we thought, and what farmers and agents were saying, too."

"I am really looking forward to meeting with my local elected leaders from Iowa in December and January," added Backer. "I am meeting with folks from Senator Ernst, Senator Grassley, and Congressman Young's offices. This is an opportunity for me to make sure that I am passing along our message of doing no harm to crop insurance with the Farm Bill."

Both employees will return to Washington, D.C. in April for the CIRB Spring Fly-in event and to graduate from the Emerging Leaders Program.

"Overall, it was just truly an amazing experience, and it has definitely made me realize that what I am doing day-to-day really does matter to a lot of people. The program has made me see the 'big' picture of crop insurance and really put things into perspective for me."
